The last day to register or update your address for this election is **Monday October 15, 2018**. If you move, your polling place might change. Be sure to update your voter registration address every time you move.



It is your responsibility as a voter to keep your voter registration up to date so that you remain eligible to vote on Election Day.

Absentee Voting Schedule

Voting by Mail: You can vote in the comfort of your own home by having a ballot mailed to you. In order to have a ballot mailed to you, voters must fill out and submit an application to the Office of Elections.

Apply for your mail ballot online at the Virginia Department of Elections > Ways to Vote > Vote Absentee by Mail.

IMPORTANT! Marked ballots must be returned to the Office of Elections no later than 7:00pm on Election Day November 6, 2018 in order to be counted. You may return your marked ballot via USPS or you may bring your voted ballot directly to the Office Elections. If you choose to bring your marked ballot to the Office you will be asked to present your Photo ID to verify the return of your ballot. **Ballots cannot be returned to the Office in care of someone else.**

Voting at an Absentee Vote Center: Voters who plan to visit an Absentee Vote Center do not need to submit an application online beforehand. Simply show up at the Vote Center most convenient for you with your Photo ID.

Know Before You Go

4 Steps for Voting Success on Election Day!

1. Know before you go...that your voter registration is up to date.

The last day to register *or* update your address for this election is **Monday October 15, 2018**. If you move, your polling place might change. Be sure to update your voter registration address every time you move.

2. Know before you go...where your polling place is.

You can easily confirm where you vote online at www.elections.virginia.gov > Where Do I Vote or call 703-792-6470 or email pwcvote@pwcgov.org.

3. Know before you go...to bring Photo ID.

4. Know before you go...to avoid long Election Day lines you can vote absentee.

You can vote absentee if:

- You commute on Election Day
- You have business outside the County on Election Day
- You cannot stand in line for a long time
- You are in the military or you are a first responder
- You are pregnant, have a disability or any kind of illness

You can vote by absentee either by mail or by visiting an Absentee Vote Center.

Vote by Mail: visit www.elections.virginia.gov and request to have an absentee ballot mailed to you. Request your mail ballot online before 5pm Tuesday October 30.

Absentee Vote Centers: Absentee Vote Centers open September 21. Visit www.pwcvotes.com for Absentee Vote Center hours & locations in Prince William County.

The last day to vote at an Absentee Vote Center is Saturday November 3 by 5pm. Bring Photo ID with you to vote at an Absentee Vote Center.
